The College of Osteopathic Medicine at Nova Southeastern University is looking forward to your arrival! **CHECK-IN and CHECK-OUT PROCEDURES:**

**Arrive:** Sunday June 11<sup>th</sup> or 18<sup>th</sup>, between 10AM and 12PM for local students. Out-of-state students should arrive between 9AM- 1PM, so that we can arrange for transportation (*be sure to send us all of your travel information*). A brief orientation will be held with AIM-High parents around noon and we will provide light snacks and beverages.

Camp check-in will be clearly marked at the Commons Dorm when you arrive (see address and directions below). Please follow the blue AIM-High signs on University Drive and throughout the campus.

*It is highly recommended that you NOT bring your own vehicle to campus due to limited parking space.* If your child's vehicle is the only means of transportation, please relay this information to us and *we will collect the keys at check-in on the first day for safety reasons.*

**Depart:** Saturday June 17<sup>th</sup> or 24<sup>th</sup>, after 12PM. We will be ending our week by sharing brunch (10AM-12PM) in the Cafeteria in the Terry Building. A number of College of Osteopathic Medicine faculty, as well staff from the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, will be available to respond to questions and provide a tour of our beautiful campus. After brunch, students are permitted to depart AIM-High.
