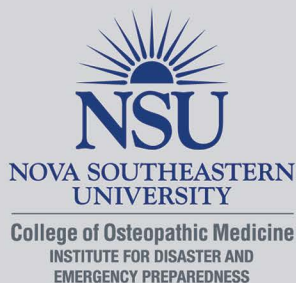

#### COURSE DETAILS

##### Hazardous Materials Awareness Course (8 hours of classroom instruction)

- Introduction to the laws, standards, and regulations that apply to hazardous materials incidents and response
- Insight on recognition of a hazardous materials incident, notification of appropriate authorities, and maintenance of the safety of personnel
- Designed to provide workers employed in maritime-related industries with the skills required by OSHA 29 CFR 1910.120

##### Hazardous Materials Operations Course (24 hours: 16 hours in classroom and 8 hours of hands-on exercises)

- Focus on providing personnel with the knowledge and skills to take defensive actions at a scene involving hazardous materials or waste to protect the public, property, and the environment
- Provide understanding of the appropriate response and implementation of plans to reach favorable outcomes

##### Hazardous Materials Technician Course (40 hours: 24 hours in classroom and 16 hours of hands-on exercises)

- Course completion results in ability to safely and effectively operate in a hazardous materials environment
- Demonstrate proficiency in analyzing a hazardous incident, develop an appropriate response plan, implement the response plan, evaluate the progress of the response, and adjust the plan necessary to change the outcomes favorably and be able to terminate the response successfully

The training courses and field exercises provided satisfy the minimum requirements as specified in federal Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA) rules and other related regulations as well as the minimum requirements specified in the Minimum Criteria for Worker Health and Safety Training for Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response, and the 29 CFR 1910.120 requirements (Basic and Operations level courses) and SARA 126 regulations (Technician/Management level course).
