Demographic: Founded in 1828, GHSU - Medical College of Georgia in Augusta is the health sciences University of the University System of Georgia. The School of Medicine is among the oldest existing medical schools in the United States. GHSU - MCG has nearly 2,000 students in five schools: medicine, dentistry, graduate studies, allied health sciences and nursing, as well as about 400 residents and fellows in medicine and dentistry and nearly 90 postdoctoral fellows.

A vital source of GHSU's/MCG's program is the 520 bed GHSU - Medical College of Georgia Hospital, the MCG Children's Medical Center and over 80 clinics.
