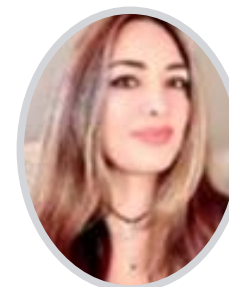

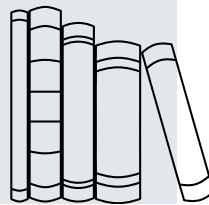

INIM offers monthly research seminars hosted by renowned faculty to present cutting-edge research related to human health and disease.

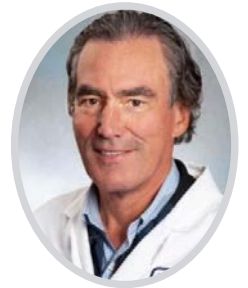
