* Graduation Rate is the program's Advertised Length of Completion which is how long the program is designed to complete as written.

** Job Placement Rate is the percentage of graduates from the cohort year that are employed utilizing skills learned in the COAMFTE accredited program.

- Of the 2018–2019^ cohort, 46.15% (N=6) have graduated, and with the 8-year length of the program, students still have one year to complete the program. 100 % of those who graduated are employed.
- Of the 2019–2020^^ cohort, 33% (N=3) have graduated, and with the 8-year length of the program, students still have two years to complete the program. 100 % of those who graduated are employed.
- Of the 2020–2021^^^ cohort, 50% (N=2) have graduated, and with the 8-year length of the program, students still have three years to complete the program. 100 % of those who graduated are employed.
- The rest of the cohorts are still in the process of meeting course and program requirements, and with the 8-year length of the program, they still have four or more years left to complete the program.
